End Human Trafficking

Signs that someone may be a victim:

They appear withdrawn or intimidated.

Fearful, anxious, defensive, secretive.

They claim to be visiting but aren't able to clarify where they're staying.

They're made up to look older than they really are.

They may show signs of physical abuse.

They may have tattoos that mark ownership.

The person they're with seems to be preventing them from moving about freely.

Being controlled, someone speaking for them, never seen alone.
