Human trafficking involves the recruitment, transportation, or harbouring of persons for the purpose of exploitation (typically in the sex industry or for forced labour).

Human trafficking may occur across or within borders. Victims are often transported from one place to another using public transportation. You can play a role by recognizing the signs of human trafficking and calling police.

End Human Trafficking

Signs that someone may be a victim:

International victims might have a very limited knowledge of English (if any) and will often travel with others, but one person will be in charge of the group.

They may show signs of malnourishment.

They may not have a passport or other identification, or credit cards of their own.

They may be traveling with minimal luggage.

They may show signs of branding or scarring (indicating ownership by the trafficker).

They may express fear and intimidation through facial expressions and/or body language.

They may claim to be visiting but are unable to clarify where they are staying.

The person/people they're with seem to be preventing them from moving about freely.
